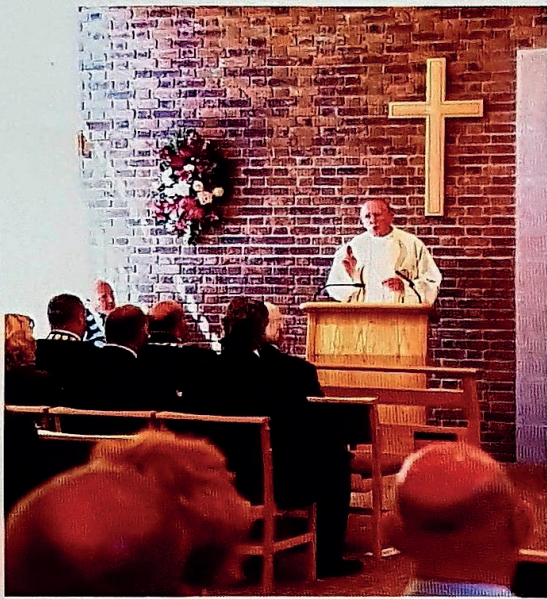


West Lancashire Cemetery & Crematorium



Bishop Thomas Williams spoke passionately about his many years of taking Funeral Services and the great importance that a Funeral has for the Bereaved. The Bishop told two stories of Funeral services that he has taken at opposite ends of the social spectrum, one was for a well known personality, the other for a man with no relatives and whose Cadaver had lain for months unclaimed in a Liverpool Mortuary, each as important as the other.
